The State of Florida has initiated the **First Conference on Good Governance and Democracy for the Hemisphere: Challenges and Opportunities**, which is being organized by Florida International University's Institute for Public Management and Community Service (IPMCS). At the same time, for its twelth year, **The Miami Herald is organizing the Americas Conference**[®] with the partnership of the Inter-American Development Bank. The four organizations—**State of Florida**, **The Miami Herald**, **Florida International University, Inter-American Development Bank**—have combined their efforts to plan this year's **Americas Conference**[®] which will be hosted at the historic Biltmore Hotel, Miami, FL, October 1-3, 2008. The theme of the conference will be *"New Leadership—New Focus: Good Governance and Economic Development for the Hemisphere"*.

BACKGROUND As the gateway to the hemisphere, and a very large trading partner with Latin America, the State of Florida has an especially great interest in the democratic stability and economic development of Latin America. Indeed, Florida's economy is far more dependent on hemispheric stability and growth than that of any other single state. As one means to encourage democratic and economic stability in the region, the State of Florida has established an annual conference on good governance and democracy in the hemisphere. High-ranking State officials are hosting the main conference, which are being preceded by regional seminars held in Latin America. These events bring together leaders from the private sector, all levels of government and non-governmental organizations from throughout the Hemisphere.

The conference will provide an opportunity for people from South and Central America, the Caribbean and North America to share ideas and experiences, to interact with one another and to promote best practices in democratic institution building. In that way, it will play an important role in encouraging the development and strengthening of democratic institutions throughout the hemisphere. It will serve not only to highlight and reinforce democratic practice, but also to provide encouragement and sustenance to those on the front lines of building democracy in their countries.

OBJECTIVE The objective of the conference is to promote the exchange of debate and reflection of the importance of good governance in order to strengthen democracy within our hemisphere. There will be a special emphasis given to the role of legislators, political parties, and members of the executive branch of government.

The conference seeks to create a regional dialogue with the participation of national and regional officials, legislators (national, provincial/state), political parties, civil society, businesspersons and international organizations to deliberate on the best policies and practices in order to strengthen democracy and good governance in the hemisphere.

THEMES The following topics will be discussed at the event:

- **1.** Strengthening Democracy and Governance for the Region: Old Challenges, New Perspectives
- **2.** The Role of Political Parties in the Up-coming Elections
- 3. Civic Engagement and Democratic Accountability
- 4. The Role of the Media in a Democracy
- **5.** Inequality, Race and Ethnicity in a Democratic Hemisphere

- 6. The Role of businesspersons in the Free Trade Agreements: Processes of Integration and Competitiveness
- Thematic policy items will also be discussed like Security, Housing, FreeTrade and Energy agendas for the region.

REGIONAL SEMINARS In preparation for the final conference, the IPMCS has hosted regional seminars in San Jose, Costa Rica; Rio de Janeiro, Brazil; Asuncion, Paraguay; and Montevideo, Uruguay. The objective of the seminars was to discuss and integrate the regional issues in the final conference agenda, planned for October 1-3 at the Biltmore hotel.

AMERICAS CONFERENCE® The Americas Conference® is the region's premier business and political forum on Latin America and the Caribbean. Last year, over 650 international executives and government leaders attended. The Miami Herald's credibility and extensive contacts have been critical factors in the conference's success.
